In Tharandt there is one of the oldest schools of forestry in the world.

In 1811 Heinrich Cotta initiated forest education at Tharandt.

This private establishment was taken over by the state as Royal Forest Academy of Saxony in 1816.

The affiliation to the Dresden College of Technology was performed in 1929.






Research fields and methodological orientation

Socio-economic diagnosis

- international forest policy/politics: international agreements, development trends and case studies
- land use dynamics and forestry development
- forest based production systems
- assessment of the framework of forest based management systems
- silvicultural treatment of forest- and wood dominated ecosystems
- investigations into stand structure and changes of tropical forest ecosystems
- cultural aspects of forest production, including local knowledge systems, religion and gender

Projection and modelling

- studies of the guiding principles of forestry in the context of a dynamic environment
- forest sector analysis in tropical countries, contribution of forestry to rural development, non-conventional forestry, land use planning
- stability models for forest management
- methodological aspects of regional/project planning, social transition, intervention theories, extension








Research fields and methodological orientation

- integrative landscape planning
- participatory planning and decision structures

- implementing urban forestry

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



Overview of modules






