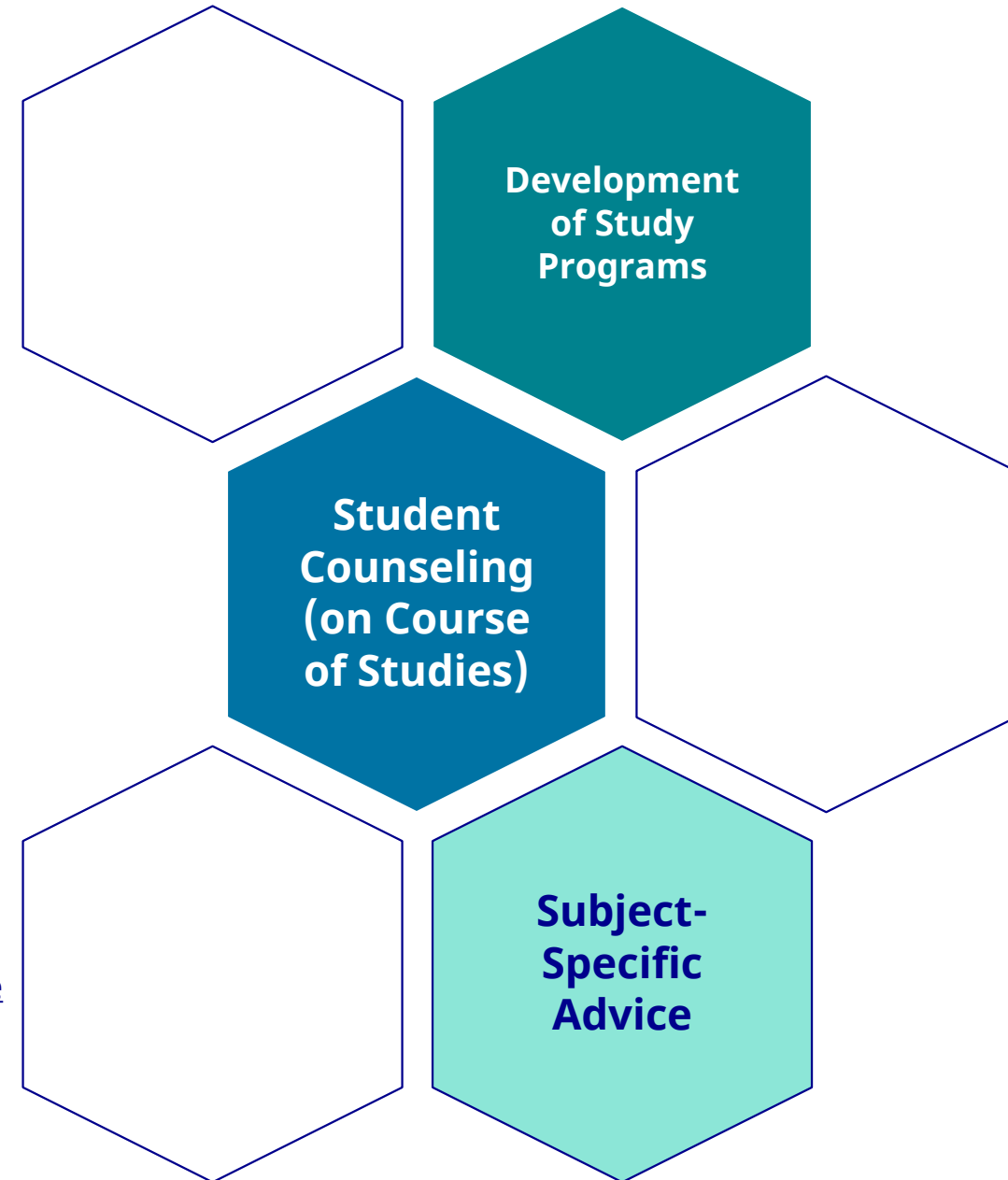

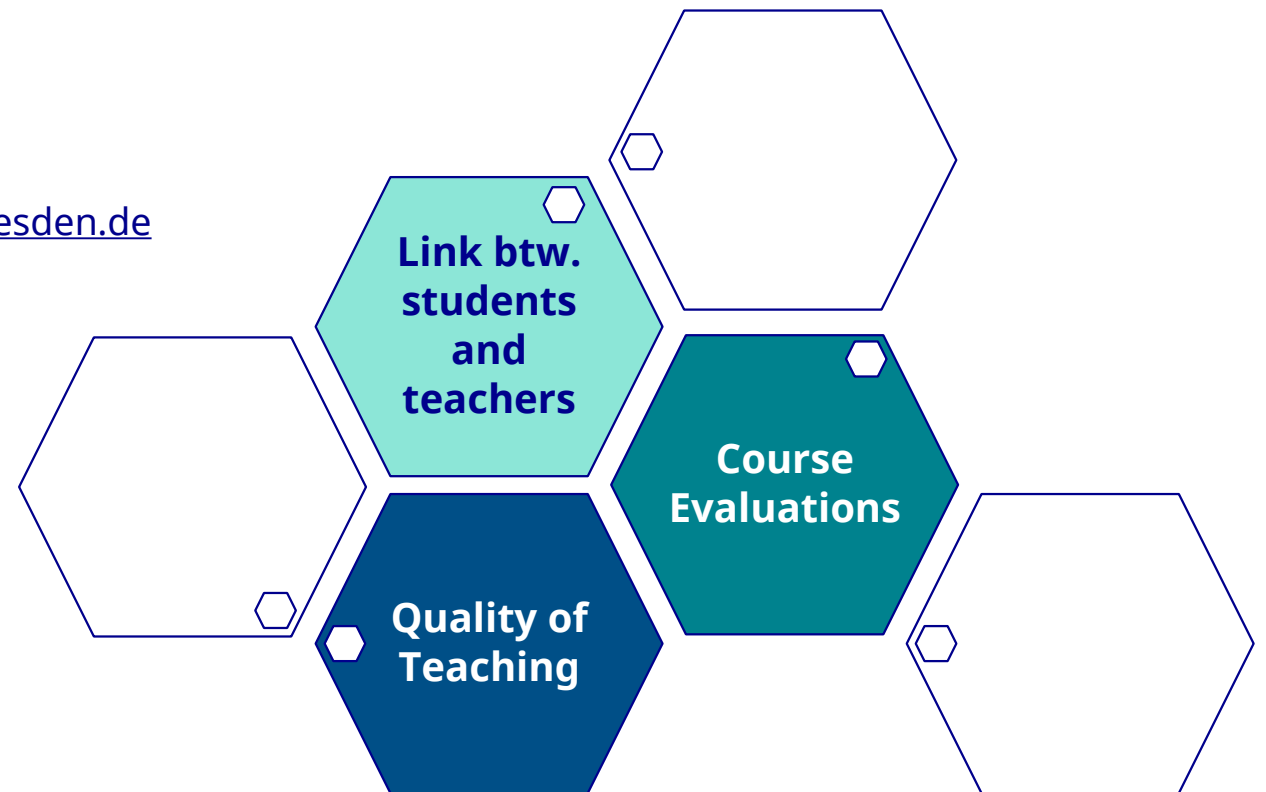

# Enrollment and Studying at TU Dresden

## Late Arrival

If your visa is delayed, you may arrive **until the end of October**.

**Later arrivals will not be accepted**, because too many lectures, courses, and possibly even examinations will have been missed.

In this case, you will have to **postpone** the start of your studies by one year. This means:

- cancellation of current enrollment, application for refund of semester contribution
- re-application for winter semester 2026
  - It is not necessary to re-apply via uni-assist!
  - You can re-apply easily via the TUD application portal, **starting April 1, 2026 !**

# How to Settle in? -- Formalities



## **directly = within two weeks after your arrival in Dresden:**

- registration with the City of Dresden (EU- and Non-EU citizens) at the Dresden citizens' offices
- by appointment or open office hours:

Tuesday and Thursday 1 - 4 p.m.

## **within good time = 3 months before the visa/residence permit expires:**

- application for residence permit/extension at the Foreigners Registration Office/Foreigners authority (Non-EU only)
- First write to the general e-mail address of the foreigners authority. Send the necessary documents directly in PDF format.

# Learning-Teaching-Agreement



= document that shapes the culture of our faculty

= value-oriented policy paper

→ take it seriously, you will be measured against it.

Everyone is welcome at our faculty. Life and cooperation in our faculty are based on respect, tolerance, and equal rights for all people, regardless of ethnic origin, gender, sexual identity, religion, ideology, physical or mental detriment, or age (see Art. 1, German constitution).

Self-Responsibility	<p>Students and lecturers are aware of their roles:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Students appreciate their opportunity to study here, work autonomously, inform themselves independently about study modalities, and support each other.</li><li>- Teachers offer didactically sound classes, clearly formulate their expectations, are open to questions, provide information in due time, and take the workloads of students into account.</li></ul>
Assessment	<p>Teachers assess transparently. They disclose their assessment criteria in a comprehensible manner and respond to further inquiry.</p> <p>Teachers will let their students know if they exceed the regular correction period of four weeks. Students take the realities of teachers' lives into account.</p>
