

**Regulations**  
**for the issuance and registration of the Master's thesis**  
**at the "Friedrich List" Faculty of Transport and Traffic Sciences**  
**of TUD Dresden University of Technology**  
**for the Master's degree programs in Railway System Engineering,**  
**Air Transport and Logistics, Electrical Transportation Systems, and**  
**Air Transport and Logistics**

- (1) Regulations regarding the Master's thesis are set out in the examination regulations for the Master's programs, including in §§ 18, 23 and 25 and, according to MPO 2023, in §§ 25 - 29 and §§ 31, 34, 35.
- (2) Pursuant to the standard period of study, the Master's thesis is written in the 4<sup>th</sup> semester. The topic of the Master's thesis will be officially issued at the latest at the beginning of the semester following the completion of the last module examination.
- (3) Students can apply for admission/registration for the final thesis at the Examination Office. After the examiners have confirmed that they will supervise the thesis, the registration must be submitted to the Examination Office no later than the day the thesis topic is handed out.
- (4) The university lecturer is responsible for the research question/thesis topic and the user agreement, and hands these over to the Examination Office no later than one day before the intended issue.
- (5) The candidate receives the detailed research question at the Examination Office on the day of issue. It is signed by the responsible examiner. The dates on which the research question is issued and the latest date for submission of the written thesis are recorded, along with the date of the issuance. The student confirms receipt of the research question and, by signing, acknowledges the applicable regulations.
- (6) The Examination Committee has issued regulations for withdrawing from the thesis and for extending the allotted time to complete it due to illness. These are published on the Examination Office's website.
- (7) If students wish to extend the period for completing their Master's thesis for reasons other than illness, they must submit a request to the Examination Office no later than two weeks before the submission deadline.
- (8) The Master's thesis must be submitted to the Examination Office, which will check that the scheduled deadline for submission has been met, confirm the submission, and pass the thesis on to the relevant university lecturer.

This regulation was amended on January 27, 2025 and will come into force on April 1, 2025.
