



Interdisciplinary Seminar on Health Economics

Modalities

- 2 semester hours in 3 blocks per 6 hrs.
- Participants receive 5 CP for presentation, seminar paper and active seminar participation
- 12-16 (Master- / PhD students)
- Language: English (exceptionally: German)
- The seminar is allocated to the modules: "Recent topics in Econometrics" MA/D-WW-ERG-1901 or "Methodological foundations" MA/D-WW-MG.

Timeframe

- March/April: Identification of topics, students are required to make a proposal according to their individual study interests or research objectives
- End of June: oral presentation
- July: final submission of the paper version

Objectives

- The interdisciplinary seminar targets at Master- and PhD students at the Faculty of Business and Economics and other Faculties at TUD with an interest in health economics research.
- In the first step, the participants shall identify a topic in health-science within the context of Economics, Business Administration, (empirical) Health Sciences and Public Health. In the second step, participants shall present and discuss their chosen topic in an interdisciplinary context.

Prerequisites

- Interest in the field of health economics and public health with an advanced knowledge in Economics or Business Administration and basic background in Health Sciences/Public Health, or vice versa.
