Dresden University of Technology is proud to host the 6th Education & Technology (E&T) Summer School between 08.–16. June 2013. This year the topic chosen is „**eLearning meets eScience**“ due to the fact that the summer school is combined with Conference of the eScience Research Network Saxony. By that the event hopes to be a further inspiring step in the series of summer schools for Ph.D. candidates, bringing together young and experienced researchers from all over the world.

The core partnership has been developed by the European partners University of Bergen, TU Dresden, Université de Strasbourg, PHD Linz and UITM Rzeszow, now together with further partners from Indonesia (Graduate School of Yogyakarta State University) and Egypt (Suez Canal University). The aim of the preceding project „Education & Technology“ was to develop, test and implement a curriculum at postgraduate level in the field of educational & technology. In order to reach that goal of qualifying and graduating Ph.D. students this trans-European network has been designed to support joint Ph.D.-degrees. The English curriculum provided by the partners of the E&T network is based on the expertise of the contributing institutions.

The programme in 2013 combines again academic training on the subjects chosen with research methodology and epistemology as well as activities around social, presentation and language skills. Overall it is expected that this will help to develop internationally competitive state of the art doctoral research projects.
