BMU International Climate Initiative (IKI) b

Funding for climate change mitigation projects that bring together different actors from Germany and abroad.

Eligibility Criteria

IKI supports activities by consortia of at least two different organisations.

Eligible to participate are the following types of organisations in Germany and abroad:

- Non-governmental organisations.
- Business enterprises.
- Universities.
- Research institutions.

In addition, projects may include the participation of:

- Implementing organisations of the Federal Republic of Germany.
- Institutions in the partner countries (including accredited national implementation organisations in international or multilateral organisations).
- Multilateral organisations and institutions (eg development banks and United Nations organisations and programmes).

Projects must be implemented in one or more countries that meet the criteria for Official Development Assistance (ODA) as defined by the Development Assistance Committee (DAC) of the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD).

Standard grants:

Funding under funding priorities 1 to 11 is provided for bilateral as well as regional programmes carried out by consortia consisting of at least two partners with different comparative strengths. Regional projects are preferred. Bilateral projects are permitted, but must have a regional impact. Global projects that cover more than one geographical region are only eligible in exceptional, justified cases.

For projects under funding priorities 1 to 11 it is expected that, if possible, 50% of funding is implemented through local actors in the cooperation countries. This requirement does not directly apply to fiduciary projects applied for under funding priorities 12-13.

No bilateral projects are permitted under funding priorities 12 and 13.

All projects are expected to be completed within eight years.

IKI Small Grants:

Funding is made available for sub-national, national and regional non-profit organisations in ODA-eligible countries. For-profit non-governmental organisations are also eligible as long as their proposal has not-for-profit objectives. Organisations who apply must have at least three years of relevant experience and an average annual revenue of between €60,000 and €500,000. The 'Funding Institutions' targets larger national and regional institutions.

The conditions for reimbursement will be: 100% (direct costs) plus 25% overhead. There will be special rules for industrial partners in Innovation Actions, and for programs based on lump sums or flat rates.

Eligibility Criteria

The contest is open to all legal entities (ie natural or legal persons, including international organisations) or groups of legal entities that have completed an FP7 and/or Horizon 2020 project by the close of the competition.

Natural persons such as ERC principal investigators or MSCA fellows and legal entities principally created by past beneficiaries for the exploitation of the project results, are also eligible.

Joint applications by a group of participants are admitted. In this case, the participants must appoint a 'lead participant' to represent them towards the Commission.

Eligibility Criteria

Host Institution

Eligible for funding are research-performing institutions in Germany.

This includes:

- Public and state-recognised universities, including universities of applied sciences (Fachhochschulen).
- Max Planck Institutes, Helmholtz Institutes, Leibniz Institutes, Fraunhofer Institutes.
- Federal and State Research Institutes.
- Other research-performing institutions that can convincingly demonstrate their research focus and infrastructures.

Applications are open to institutions that have not applied for Philipp Schwartz funding before.

Fellow

The fellowship may be provided to threatened researchers from any academic field and any country of origin who meet the following criteria:

- Completed doctorate or a comparable academic degree (PhD, CSc or equivalent).
- No more than five years of absence from their own country.
- Sufficient language skills required to successfully conduct their research projects.
- Proof of academic qualifications (e.g. publications).
- Potential to be integrated into the (research-related) job market.

The Humboldt Foundation imposes no restrictions with regard to country of origin or current location if the threat can be confirmed in accordance with the programme guidelines.

Applicants should note that the application will require them to proof a pertinent thread to the selected researcher. This can be done in the following ways:

- Residence status in the context of an asylum-granting procedure that confirms a recognised threat.
- Credible threat assessment from a third party, such as the Scholars at Risk Network, the Scholar Rescue Fund, or the Council for At-Risk Academics.
