

## **ERASMUS+ | AN INTRODUCTION**

- Erasmus+ is the EU Programme in the fields of education, training, youth and sport for the period 2021-2027
- Overarching aim:
  - Promoting people's educational, professional and personal development through lifelong learning
  - Key component supporting the objectives of the European Education Area, the Digital Education Action Plan 2021-2027 and the European Innovation Agenda
  - Supporting and facilitating international cooperation between organisations in the fields of education, training, youth and sport in order to empower people with more key competences
  - Facilitating the circulation of ideas, the transmission of best practices and expertise
  - Stimulating innovation and bridging Europe's knowledge, skills, and competences gap

#### **COOPERATION PARTNERSHIPS**

# Primary goal and main criteria to apply

- Increasing quality in the work, activities and practices of the organisations and institutions involved
- Development of new teaching and training practices and methods
- Enabling transformation and change (at individual, organisational or sectoral level), leading to improvements and new approaches within the participating organisations
- Supporting internationalisation
  - Minimum: three organisations from three different Programme Countries, no maximum
  - HEI: ECHE obligatory
  - Exception: Belarus and the Russian Federation are not eligible







### **COOPERATION PARTNERSHIPS**

#### Basic conditions

#### **Duration**

Between 12 and 36 months

#### Grant

- 3 fixed lump sums: EUR 120 000, EUR 250 000 and EUR 400 000
- staff costs, travel costs, subcontracting, event costs etc.
- work packages (1 project management and max. 4 work packages recommended for implementation)



Call Deadline: 5 March 2024 at 12:00:00 (midday Brussels time)







# CAPACITY BUILDING IN HIGHER EDUCATION Primary goal and main criteria to apply

- Cooperation projects and partnerships between the EU and neighboring European countries, Asia, Latin America and Africa
- support the relevance, quality, modernisation, accessibility and internationalisation of Higher Education in the Partner Countries
- Priorities:
  - Green Deal
  - Digital Transformation
  - Governance, peace, security and human development
  - Integration of migrants
  - Sustainable growth and jobs

- → Russia and Belarus not eligible
- → UK participation not possible

#### Three types of CBHE:

- national projects
- multi-country regional projects
- multi-country cross-regional projects

Minimum: 2 organisations from 2 different Programme countries + 2 organisations from each Partner Country







## **CAPACITY BUILDING IN HIGHER EDUCATION**

#### Basic conditions

#### Strand 1

- Fostering access to cooperation in Higher Education
- Designed for Newcomers (less experienced HEIs)

## Duration

24 or 36 months

Funding

200 000 - EUR 400 000

#### Strand 2

- Partnerships for transformation in Higher Education
- Transfer of experience and good practice

**Duration** 

24 or 36 months

**Funding** 

400 000 - EUR 800 000

#### Strand 3

- Structural reform projects
- Development of sustainable HE systems (involvement of National Authorities)

**Duration** 

36 or 48 months

**Funding** 

600 000 - EUR 1 000 000

## Primary goal and main criteria to apply

- stimulating a sense of entrepreneurial attitudes
- improving the quality and relevance of skills developed and certified through education and training systems
- facilitating the flow and co-creation of knowledge between Higher Education and vocational education and training, research, the public sector and the business sector

#### **Alliances for Education and Enterprises**

- Boosting innovation in HE, VET and business
- Developing entrepreneurship and skills
- Stimulating flow and exchange of knowledge

- At least 3 labour market actors and 3 education and training providers, as full partners
- At least one HEI and one VET provider involved as full partner

#### **Duration**

24 or 36 months

#### **Funding**

- Max. EUR 1 mio. (2 years project)
- Max. EUR 1.5 mio. (3 years project)
- Limited to a max. of 80% of the estimated budget

#### Lot 2

#### Consortium

- At least 8 Programme countries, involving a minimum of 12 full partners
- At least 5 labour market actors and 5 education and training providers, as full partners
- At least one HE institution and one VET provider involved as full partner

#### **Duration**

48 months

#### **Funding**

- Max. EUR 4 mio.
- Limited to a max. of 80% of the estimated budget

#### **ERASMUS MUNDUS ACTION**

## Primary goal and main criteria to apply

Fostering excellence and worldwide internationalisation of HEI via study programmes at Master-level

• jointly delivered and jointly recognised by HEI (established in Europe) and open to institutions in other countries of the world.

## EMJM Erasmus Mundus Joint Master

- Demonstrate a jointly designed, unique and excellent academic curriculum
- Carry out an international master's degree with a double degree or a joint degree

# **EMDM Erasmus Mundus Design Measures**

 Development of new EMJM-project with participation of (a) programme countries, (b) institutions, and/or (c) thematic areas that are under-represented in Erasmus Mundus.







#### **ERASMUS MUNDUS ACTION**

#### Basic conditions

#### **EMJM**

#### Consortium

- At least 3 universities in 3 different countries
- At least 2 universities from Erasmus programme countries

#### **Duration**

• 6 years (at least 4 years of a 1-2 year course)

#### **Funding**

- Institutional costs per enrolled student (EUR 750 per month of study) for a maximum of 100 enrolled students (1.8 million per programme)
- Full scholarships for max. 60 students (EUR 1 400 per month)
- Contribution to special needs

#### **EMDM**

#### Consortium

1 university involved in the future EMJM

#### **Duration**

15 months

#### **Funding**

• EUR 55 000 as a lump-sum grant




