



As part of its post-graduate program, *Schaufler Kolleg@TU Dresden*, the Schaufler Lab@TU Dresden, co-financed by The Schaufler Foundation and the Technische Universität Dresden, is offering

10 doctoral fellowships

starting **as soon as possible** and continuing for a period of 2 years, with the option of a one year extension. The topic is “Artificial Intelligence as a Characteristic and Consequence of Social and Cultural Change.” The fellowship (1,750.00 EUR monthly, plus a grant for the cost of materials) is intended for young scholars in the humanities and social sciences.

In the Schaufler Lab@TU Dresden, researchers in the humanities and social sciences will be cooperating over the next three years with artists and researchers in STEM disciplines on the subject of “AI as a Characteristic and Consequence of Social and Cultural Change.” They will explore the question of how Artificial Intelligence (AI) -- understood as both technological information processing and as the object of cultural imagination -- changes cultural and social structures and is itself produced and changed by these forces. Doctoral projects may approach the topic from ethical, social, legal, political, historical, aesthetic and media-based perspectives.

The University supports the work-life balance of its members and offers family-friendly work-study conditions. In addition, the graduate academy and other central institutes offer professional development and qualification opportunities, such as project management, soft skills and language courses.

Applicants are expected to have a qualifying degree in the humanities or social sciences and to cooperate enthusiastically on interdisciplinary projects and research with artists as part of the Schaufler Labs@TU Dresden. Common areas for work and study will be made available. Participation in the program’s teaching activities is obligatory. Professional development and qualification opportunities related to AI are also offered. Women are expressly invited to apply, as well as people with disabilities.

Fellowship candidates must submit a statement of purpose, CV, references and a project proposal of no more than 20,000 characters. Interdisciplinary projects with double supervision are preferred, such as combinations of humanities/social sciences with natural sciences/engineering.
