<b>Beschreibung/ Ziele der Veranstaltung</b>	<p>As we know from many a critical source, neoliberalism is everywhere: Transforming our educational institutions, corroding welfare system, even turning every individual into an economic unit rationally calculating costs and benefits. But if neoliberalism is everywhere, does this term still hold any analytic purchase? At the center of many analyses that aim to make sense of our current period by denouncing the effects of the neoliberal sprawl, we find the legacy of Michel Foucault. Indeed, in recent years, Foucault's analysis of liberalism and neoliberalism has become a commonplace in the critical social sciences. Used to diagnose an increasingly economized and governmentalized everyday life, the publication of Foucault's lecture courses from 1977-'78 and 1978-'79 at the Collège de France under the titles of <i>Security, Territory, Population</i> and <i>The Birth of Biopolitics</i>, respectively, has inaugurated a slew of research into the governing mechanisms of liberal democracies. This seminar will introduce the basic ideas of Foucault's work on liberalism and critically engage some of the literature that subsequently built on this foundation. Beginning with his</p>

	<p>methodological framework, the course will lay out some of Foucault's core research commitments including his attention to critique and crises within liberal discourses. It will trace particular lines of inquiry from his interest in securitization and the normed practices it produced, the development of the idea of population and the rise of expertise surrounding it, to the market as a site of veridiction and the homo oeconomicus as an entrepreneur of himself. Finally, the course will conclude by drawing some consequences for the theoretical and empirical study of the contemporary through examples from the field of governmentality studies.
