

**Degree Requirements for the
Major in Classical Languages
within the
Consecutive Master-of-Arts Program
in Languages, Literatures, and Cultures**

As of April 2, 2015

Nota bene: The official language of all documents of the Faculty of Linguistics, Literature and Cultural Studies is GERMAN. The following document is an English translation for which no liability is assumed. Only the German version is legally binding.

Pursuant to § 34 Paragraph 1 Clause 1 of the Law of the Independence of Universities in the Free State of Saxony (Saxon University Independence Law – SächsHSFG) in the version of its publication from January 15, 2013 (SächsGVBl. p. 3), Dresden University of Technology enacts the following examination regulations as statutes.

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§ 1

Scope

Pursuant to the Saxon Law of the Independence of Universities and pursuant to the examination regulations of the consecutive M.A. Program in Languages, Literatures, and Cultures, these degree requirements regulate the goals, contents, curriculum, and syllabus of the major in Classical Languages in the consecutive Master-of-Arts Program in Languages, Literatures, and Cultures at Dresden University of Technology. These requirements are a supplement to the degree requirements for the consecutive Master-of-Arts Program in Languages, Literatures, and Cultures of #date of drafting# in the version valid at any given time.

§ 2

Goals of the Program

(1) Upon completion of the major in Classical Languages, the student has achieved the qualification of a scholar in Classical Languages. Building on the knowledge achieved in a pertinent Bachelor-of-Arts Program, the student has acquired the competence for the diachronic, synchronic, and comparative analysis of the languages, literatures, and cultures of classical antiquity. S/he has been trained to recognize representative examples and larger connections of cultural processes and structures in Greco-Roman antiquity and to work with the methodology of Linguistics, Literary Studies, and Cultural Studies. The student has excellent proficiency in one and fairly good command of the other Classical language. S/he is familiar with the methodology employed in the analysis of literary texts and cultural processes of antiquity and furthermore possesses the ability to impart their insights to a larger audience.

(2) On account of their subject-specific expertise, their language proficiency and skills, and their practical competence in dealing with academic media and forms of organization, the student has the ability to engage in independent research into Classical Languages, particularly drawing on their expertise regarding types of texts. S/he can cope with diverse and complex assignments in technical writing, academic editing and publishing, in subject-specific publishing houses, in the public and private media, and in trade journalism.

§ 3

Admissions Requirements

(1) Apart from the admissions requirements specified in § 3 of the degree requirements of the Master-of-Arts Program in Languages, Literatures, and Cultures, there are further subject matter admissions requirements for the major in Classical Languages. Prerequisite for admission to the Program is a first university degree from a pertinent Bachelor-of-Arts or equivalent Program that is recognized in Germany, that qualifies the candidate for professional work, and whose Classical-language share of the Program has to have been a minimum of 60 credit points or a third of the subject matter contents.

(2) An additional admissions requirement is proof of the so-called ‘Latinum’ and the so-called ‘Graecum’. Proof of the fulfillment of this admissions requirement can be provided by adducing a pertinent Bachelor-of-Arts certificate, an Abitur certificate, or a supplementary examination (“Ergänzungsprüfung”) from an institution other than Dresden University of Technology.

§ 4

Curriculum and Syllabus of the Program

(1) The Program consists of four elective modules in the subject-matter training (linguistics, literature, and cultural studies) and three elective modules in language training, leaving ample room for prioritization by the student. The elective modules allow for a choice between the concentrations “Specialization Latin” or “Specialization Greek” as well as between the concentrations “Add-On Latin” and “Add-On Greek”, of which the student has to pick and complete one each.

(2) The detailed listing of the modules can be seen in Attachments 1 and 2 of the degree requirements for the major in Classical Languages of the Master-of-Arts Program in Languages, Literatures, and Cultures.

§ 5

Contents of the Program

The Program covers the core areas of the Classical Languages: the languages of Greek and Latin; the works, authors, and epochs of Greek and Roman Literature; Greco-Roman Culture as well as the methodology of their academic investigation. Additional components include the theoretical and practical acquisition of skills in academic publishing as well as in the organization of subject-specific research and its transmission to a wider audience.

§ 6

Entry into Force and Publication

These degree requirements become effective as of October 1, 2013, and are published in the Official Announcements (“Amtliche Bekanntmachungen”) of Dresden University of Technology.
