### Degree Requirements for the Major in German of the Consecutive Master-of-Arts Program in Languages, Literatures, and Cultures

As of April 2, 2015

Nota bene: The official language of all documents of the Faculty of Linguistics, Literature and Cultural Studies is GERMAN. The following document is an English translation for which no liability is assumed. Only the German version is legally binding.

Pursuant to § 34 Paragraph 1 Clause 1 of the Law of the Independence of Universities in the Free State of Saxony (Saxon University Independence Law – SächsHSFG) in the version of its publication from January 15, 2013 (SächsGVBl. p. 3), Dresden University of Technology enacts the following examination regulations as statutes.

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Pursuant to the Saxon University Independence Law and pursuant to the examination regulations of the consecutive M.A. Program in Languages, Literatures, and Cultures, these degree requirements regulate the goals, contents, curriculum, and syllabus of the major in German in the consecutive Master-of-Arts Program in Languages, Literatures, and Cultures at Dresden University of Technology. These requirements are a supplement to the degree requirements for the consecutive Master-of-Arts Program in Languages, Literatures, and Cultures of #date of drafting# in the version valid at any given time.

#### § 2 Goals of the Program

(1) Upon completion of the major in German, the student has achieved qualification as a scholar in German Studies with concentrations of their own choosing in German Linguistics, Literature, or Culture. Building on the knowledge attained in a pertinent Bachelor-of-Arts Program, the consecutive Master-of-Arts Program with a major in German endows the student with competences for the systematic, diachronic, synchronic, and comparative analysis of literary texts and media-based linguistic utterances in intra- and intercultural communication. The student has learned how to identify cultural processes and structures of communicative and literary-medial phenomena in theory as well as case by case and has been trained to work with the current techniques of linguistics, literary studies, and cultural studies. Learning outcomes are subject-specific expertise and knowledge, particularly the ability to work out an assigned representative topic in its respective context in a well-organized and argumentatively stringent manner according to academic principles. Upon completion of the Program, the student commands methods for the analysis of various sign formations in their intra- and intercultural contexts.

The graduate with a major in German has got consolidated knowledge and competences in German Linguistics, Literature, and Culture, which enable him/her to engage in independent research and teaching in German Studies and interdisciplinary contexts as well as undertake autonomous work in such diverse areas as research, education, academic publishing, media, and journalism, cultural management, international corporate communication, and international organizations.

# § 3 Admissions Requirements

Apart from the admissions requirements specified in § 3 of the degree requirements of the Master-of-Arts Program in Languages, Literatures, and Cultures, there are further subject matter admissions requirements for the major in German. Prerequisite for admission to the Program is a first university degree from a pertinent Bachelor-of-Arts or equivalent Program recognized in Germany and qualifying the candidate for professional work, in which the German Studies proportion of the Program has to have been a minimum of 60 credit points or a third of the subject-specific contents.

#### § 4 Curriculum and Syllabus of the Program

- (1) The Program consists of four compulsory modules and two elective modules, whose detailed listing can be seen in Attachment 1 of the degree requirements. Choices and focus-setting have been enabled. On offer are the areas of literature and culture as well as language and culture.
- (2) A detailed listing of the modules can be seen in Attachments 1 and 2 of the degree requirements for the major in German in the Master-of-Arts Program in Languages, Literatures, and Cultures.

#### § 5 Contents of the Program

The study contents include curricular material and topics from German Linguistics, Literature, and Culture. Further contents are determined by historical, contextual, intertextual, textual, comparativist, intermedial, theoretical-methodological, and practical aspects of the subject.

## § 6 Entry into Force and Publication

These degree requirements become effective as of October 1, 2013, and are published in the Official Announcements of Dresden University of Technology ("Amtliche Bekanntmachungen").
