

**Degree Requirements for the
Major in Slavic Languages
within the
Consecutive Master-of-Arts Program of
Linguistics, Literary Studies, and Cultural Studies**

As of April 2, 2015

Nota bene: The official language of all documents of the Faculty of Linguistics, Literature and Cultural Studies is GERMAN. The following document is an English translation for which no liability is assumed. Only the German version is legally binding.

Pursuant to § 34 Paragraph 1 Clause 1 of the Law of the Independence of Universities in the Free State of Saxony (Saxon University Independence Law – SächsHSFG) in the version of its publication from January 15, 2013 (SächsGVBl. p. 3), Dresden University of Technology enacts the following examination regulations as statutes.

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§ 1

Scope

Pursuant to the Saxon Law of the Independence of Universities and pursuant to the examination regulations of the consecutive M.A. Program in Languages, Literatures, and Cultures, these degree requirements regulate the goals, contents, curriculum, and syllabus of the major in Slavic Languages of the consecutive Master-of-Arts Program in Languages, Literatures, and Cultures at Dresden University of Technology. These requirements are a supplement to the degree requirements for the consecutive Master-of-Arts Program in Languages, Literatures, and Cultures of #date of drafting# in the version valid at the given time.

§ 2

Goals of the Program

(1) Upon completion of the consecutive Master-of-Arts Program with a major in Slavic Languages, the student has achieved the qualification of a scholar in Slavic Languages with concentrations of their own choosing in Linguistics, Literary Studies, or Cultural Studies. Building on the knowledge attained in a pertinent Bachelor-of-Arts Program, s/he has in the MA Program acquired comprehensive monolingual as well as comparative competences for the subject-specific (linguistic, literary, or cultural) analysis of Slavic texts as well as for the evaluation and treatment of German–Slavic questions from cultural history and the present. In addition, s/he commands at least two of the three Slavic languages of Polish, Russian, or Czech, and has got theoretical and practical knowledge of the academic and popular science publishing in these languages, including techniques of presenting and transmitting research results to the public.

(2) The graduate has acquired such subject expertise, language proficiency, and practical research media competence as will enable him/her to perform independent work in a various fields of Slavic Studies, particularly in terms of the text type competences required. S/he can cope with a variety of complex assignments in research, academic publishing and editing, specialized publishing, public and private media, expert journalism, in the economy, in culture and politics, as well as in international organizations. S/he is an expert at the Slavic cultural areas and, depending on the focus and concentration, also at the corresponding intercultural communication between the Slavic target area and the German-speaking cultural area involved.

§ 3

Admissions Requirements

Apart from the admissions requirements specified in § 3 of the degree requirements of the Master-of-Arts Program in Languages, Literatures, and Cultures, there are further subject matter admissions requirements for the major in Slavic Languages. Prerequisite for admission to the Program is a first university degree from a pertinent Bachelor-of-Arts or equivalent Program recognized in Germany and qualifying the candidate for professional work, in which the Slavic Languages proportion of the Program has to have been a minimum of 60 credit points or a third of the subject matter contents.

§ 4

Curriculum and Syllabus of the Program

(1) The subject-matter contingent of the Program’s curriculum includes three compulsory modules and one elective module, and the language training contingent is composed of three elective modules. In the latter contingent, the student follows up on a known Slavic language (“Old Slavine”), on the one hand, and starts learning a new Slavic language (“New Slavine”), on the other. The concentrations of Polish, Russian, and Czech are up for choice.

(2) Classes are held in German and in Polish, Russian, or Czech.

(3) A detailed listing of the modules can be seen in Attachments 1 and 2 of the degree requirements for the major in Slavic Languages of the Master-of-Arts Program in Languages, Literatures, and Cultures.

§ 5
Contents of the Program

The Program includes comparative and case-based studies in Slavic Languages, Literatures, and Cultures, language acquisition as well as the theory and practice of academic publishing. Addressed are mainly East and West Slavic cultures in past and present. The Program involves the command of at least two Slavic languages. Furthermore, the Program involves general and specific research questions and methods from academic publishing, a. o. editorial work, academic editions, and the reviewing and translating of academic and subject-matter-related texts.

§ 6
Entry into Force and Publication

These degree requirements become effective as of October 1, 2013, and are published in the Official Announcements (“Amtliche Bekanntmachungen”) of Dresden University of Technology.
