

1. How do I apply for the CMS program in addition to applying for the CMS aptitude assessment?

You must apply for the CMS program by using the online application form of the Admissions Office (Immatrikulationsamt) or the International Office for your application!

Depending on the origin of your higher education entrance qualification (HZB), the application switch will direct you either

*to the uni-assist application portal (this primarily concerns applicants with a foreign HZB) or

*to the selma application portal of TU Dresden (applicants with a domestic HZB and applicants already enrolled at TU Dresden).

2. Which credit point system do I need to use entering my data?

The credit point system, which is to be used is the European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS).

3. How can I convert credit hours into ECTS?

For example, if the module has 4 credit hours and YOUR entire degree program comprises 133 credits, conversion factor from credit hours to ECTS:

$$U = 60 \times D / CS$$

D is the number of years that the degree program comprises. **CS** is the number of credits that the entire degree program comprises, i. e. 133.

Assuming that the duration of study is **D = 3**, the conversion factor would be:

$U = 60 \times 3 / 133 = 1.35$; ECTS for the 4-credit-hour module would therefore correspond to 5.41 ECTS. Make sure to include two decimal places.

With D = 4:

$U = 60 \times 4 / 133 = 1.80$; ECTS for the module would then be 7.22 (Make sure to include two decimal places).

4. What can I do if the rows under the categories are not enough?

In case the rows are not sufficient for your data, please write the rest in the field "Comments".

5. How should I submit the module descriptions for my Bachelor's degree?

Please submit the full text of your university's official module handbook for your Bachelor's degree. Also provide a document containing a web URL (or a set of web URLs) pointing to the original documents on your university's web site for verification. If you cannot provide links to the module descriptions because they are not available on the university's website, you must have the provided module descriptions confirmed by your university with an **official stamp and a signature**, as they will otherwise not be accepted by the admissions committee.

6. What can I do, if my university does not provide an official module handbook for my Bachelor's degree?

In that case you can put together yourself a module handbook with ****detailed**** descriptions for all your courses. You must have this document confirmed by your university with an official stamp and a signature, as it will otherwise not be accepted by the admissions committee.
