Qualification objectives	Students have an elementary command of German at level A1 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages. Students can slowly and clearly articulate concrete information on familiar everyday topics, understand simple and short texts in terms of syntax, semantics, lexis and morphology with a focus on key words and by reading, infer the meaning of unknown concrete terms from the context, use simple expressions to talk about their environment and respond appropriately to simple questions .
Content	The contents of the German module are very simple texts and listening texts on everyday situations, especially in a university environment, elementary oral and written text production and interaction on this topic, development of relevant reading and listening strategies, development of simple grammatical structures and appropriate vocabulary as well as exercises on automation in various forms of work and with different media.
Teaching and learning methods	The module comprises language courses of 4 SWS and self-study.
Prerequisites for participation	No knowledge is required.
Applicability	The module is a compulsory elective module of the General Qualification in the Diploma degree program in Computer Science in the foundation course, which must be selected in accordance with the annex age 1 to the examination regulations. In the Bachelor's degree course in Computer Science, the module is a compulsory elective module of the General Qualification on, which must be selected in accordance with the annex to the examination regulations. In the Bachelor's degree program in Applied Computer Science, the module is a compulsory elective module of the General Qualification, which must be selected in accordance with the annex to the examination regulations. In the Master's degree program in Computer Science, the module is a compulsory elective module of the General Qualification, which must be selected in accordance with Annex 1 to the Examination Regulations . The module cannot be selected in the Master's degree program in Computer Science if this module or a module with essentially the same content from a degree program in which the admission requirements according to Section 3 of the study regulations have already been met has already been completed. The module fulfills the prerequisites for the modules listed under prerequisites for participation.

Requirements for earning credit points	The credit points are earned if the module examination is passed. The module examination consists of a language examination lasting 90 minutes.
Credit points and grades	5 credit points can be earned through the module. The module grade corresponds to the grade of the examination.
Module frequency	The module is offered every semester.
Workload	The total workload is 150 hours.
Module duration	The module comprises one semester.
