Qualification objectives	Students have advanced elementary communicative language skills in Russian at level A2 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages. Students can understand clearly articulated concrete information on everyday topics, understand syntactically, semantically, lexically and morphologically simple texts relating to everyday and professional experiences by reading, if the vocabulary is limited to frequently occurring and internationally understandable words, recognize different types of texts, communicate relatively easily in simple, routine situations and use connectors appropriately, describe their environment orally and in writing using simple phrases and sentences and respond to a limited number of simple questions.
Content	Contents of the module in Russian are simple texts and audio texts on everyday situations, especially in a university environment, elementary oral and written text production and interaction on this topic, development of relevant reading and listening strategies, development of grammatical structures and an extended vocabulary as well as exercises on automation in various forms of work ts and with different media.
Teaching and learning methods	The module comprises language courses of 4 SWS and self-study.
Prerequisites for participation	Russian language skills at level A1 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages are required.
Applicability	The module is a compulsory elective module of the General Qualification in the Diploma degree program in Computer Science in the foundation course, which must be selected in accordance with the annex age 1 to the examination regulations. In the Bachelor's degree course in Computer Science, the module is a compulsory elective module of the General Qualification on, which must be selected in accordance with the annex to the examination regulations. In the Bachelor's degree program in Applied Computer Science, the module is a compulsory elective module of the General Qualification, which must be selected in accordance with the appendix to the examination regulations.
