Qualification objectives	Students have basic communicative competence in Czech at level A2 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages. Students can slowly and clearly articulate concrete information on everyday topics, understand simple and short texts with reference to everyday and professional reality syntactically, semantically, lexically and morphologically by reading, if the vocabulary is limited to frequently occurring and internationally understandable words. They can use simple phrases and sentences to describe their environment orally and in writing and can largely follow short, simple conversations and very simple presentations and respond appropriately if they are familiar with the topic.
Content	Contents of the module in Czech are simple texts on everyday situations/concrete topics, especially in a university environment, simple presentations/original documents - for example announcements/en/interviews/short audio and video sequences - on this topic, development of relevant reading and listening strategies, development of simple grammatical structures and an appropriate vocabulary as well as exercises on automation in various forms of work and with different media.
Teaching and learning methods	The module comprises language courses of 4 SWS and self-study.
Prerequisites for participation	Language proficiency in Czech at level A1 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages is required.
Applicability	The module is a compulsory elective module of the General Qualification in the Diploma degree program in Computer Science in the foundation course, which must be selected in accordance with the annex age 1 to the examination regulations. In the Bachelor's degree course in Computer Science, the module is a compulsory elective module of the General Qualification on, which must be selected in accordance with the annex to the examination regulations. In the Bachelor's degree program in Applied Computer Science, the module is a compulsory elective module of the General Qualification, which must be selected in accordance with the annex to the examination regulations. In the Master's degree program in Computer Science, the module is a compulsory elective module of the General Qualification, which must be selected in accordance with Annex 1 to the Examination Regulations . The module cannot be selected in the Master's degree program in Computer Science if this module or a module with essentially the same content from a degree program in which the
