Criteria:

- By submitting the photos, the image rights are automatically transferred to MDPI and the Boysen-TU Dresden Research Training Group
- One image file per person is allowed
- Photographer and sender must be identical
- Only photos (no graphic animations or text lines)
- Only JPEG format (max. 10 MB)

Today's transport systems are characterized by the interaction of people and technology. Therefore, a long-term transformation in the socio-technical system will impact multiple fields and industries.
