And of course I would also be interested in the next week: What are your experiences with the first events that have been run. Did it work, what was good and where was it a little bit tricky...

We will continue to prepare everything in such a way that you get a decent semester! And who knows - maybe in a few years we will find out that it was a very strange semester, but maybe it was one of the very special ones, which will be especially - and I hope positively - remembered...
