Dear students of the Faculty of Mechanical Engineering,

we have now been in the summer semester for three weeks and many things are almost back to normal for those who have been here for a while and for those who started studying in the corona phase, university is really just beginning.

Part of the return to normality is that from next Tuesday, **normal office hours** will be offered again **in the examination office**. It is clear that this is still subject to hygiene regulations, i.e. masks are compulsory and we assume that you will only come to the office hours if you are healthy (quickly sending the whole examination office into quarantine would be a very counterproductive idea...). However, we would like to ask you to use the office hours only for things that really require a personal conversation (e.g. if you just want to get rid of the application for the opening of the diploma procedure, you can obviously continue to do this quite simply by e-mail) - this relieves the situation enormously, especially in the few places that we have as a waiting area in front of the examination office!
