Since 01.06.23, all theses are subject to a **plagiarism check.** You can find the procedure and information on which files you must provide in which form when submitting your thesis in the corresponding circular email from last year (https://tud.link/qk4cs4). Please remember that these files are part of the documents required for submitting the relevant work. Otherwise there will be delays and additional work that nobody needs. In this context, it should also be pointed out once again that there are **rules for the use of AI systems** that have been decided by the examination board and which must be adhered to. Apart from the fact that you have to be able to handle such systems if you want to use them in the places where they are permitted. But that's what we practise in the ChatGPT course (https://tud.link/96xvhq).

The second reminder relates to the **"Kummerkasten"**, which we set up a few years ago and which you can find in physical form in the Zeuner Building as a red letterbox next to the Examinations Office, and which also exists in electronic form at <u>kummerkasten-mw@tu-dres-den.de</u>. And you can also send your concerns here outside of the official channels, i.e. also from a "non-TU" e-mail account.
