We are currently looking for a motivated and enthusiastic student assistant to assist with two neuroimaging projects, whereby duties participant recruitment, data acquisition and assisting with the production of a formal meta-analysis. The focus of the projects is to understand the neural mechanisms underlying flexible goal-directed behaviour and learning. The meta-analysis utilizes existing neuroimaging studies which investigate the involvement of distinct thalamic nuclei, their co-activation with cortical regions, and their contribution to cognitive control and decision-making processes.

Tasks:

Participant recruitment, MRI data acquisition, data extraction, production of a meta-analysis.

We offer:

Comprehensive insight into a cognitive and clinical neuroscience lab, involvement in an international research environment, possibilities for further professional development and methodical competence.

Requirements:

- Student of psychology, medicine or related field
- Ability to work responsibly and independently
- Ability to work in a team
- Excellent command of English
- Experience in conducting psychological experiments and data analysis and interest in long-term involvement is favourable
