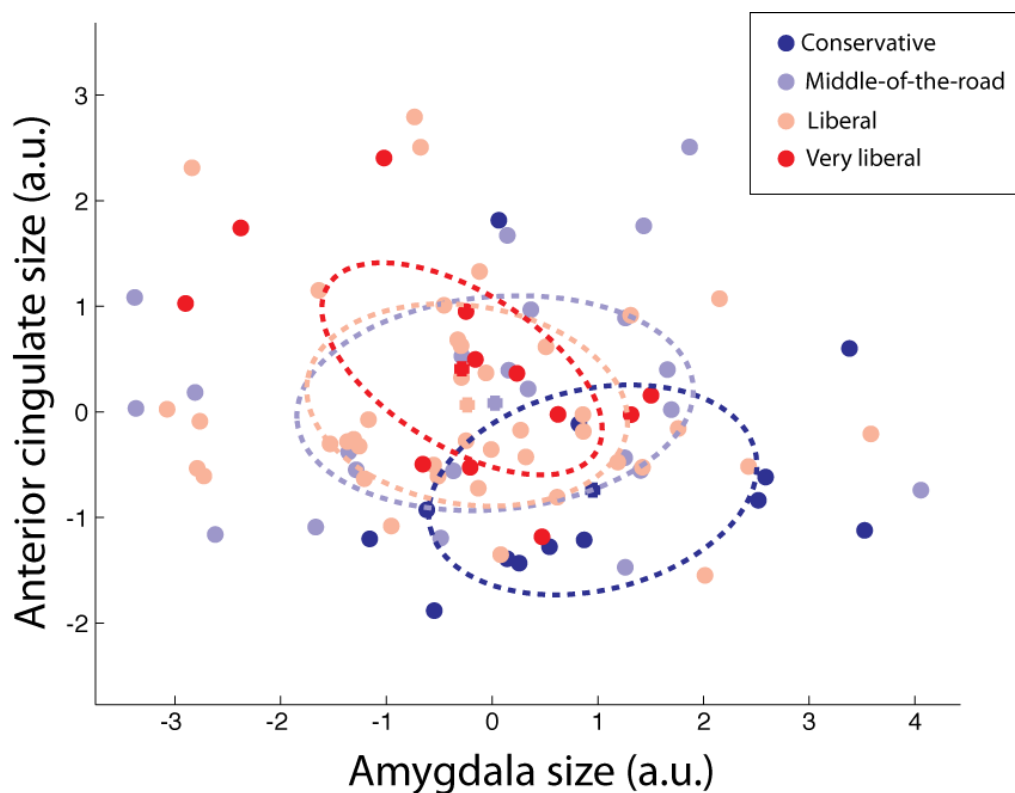

Individual data (n=90) are plotted as a function of the size of the right amygdala (x-axis) and the size of anterior cingulate cortex (y-axis). The self-reported political orientation of individuals is colour-coded from blue ('conservative') to red ('very liberal'). To illustrate the inter-individual variability of brain structures for each level of political orientation, ellipses were drawn for one standard deviation along the two principal component axes.
