Introduction to MERIT - A Standardized Tool for Hiring Procedures

A group led by Miriam Kip of the [QUEST Center for Responsible Research](#) has designed a platform called [MERIT](#) to help commissions with their work in appointment processes.

On this platform, all necessary information relevant for the commission can be stored in one place. This includes, among other things, all application documents, external reviews and protocols, information on publications, teaching concepts and teaching evaluations or equal opportunity concepts. Entries are automatically processed graphically so that applicants can be compared more easily, e.g. with regard to the acquisition of external funding.

The entire project is open source and can be further developed to include Open Science criteria. It is not yet clear how much effort is required for such adaptations. For the implementation at TUD, technical support, e.g. by the ZIH, would be necessary.
