Eike Brunner obtained his diploma in physics in 1987 and his Dr. rer nat. in 1989 from the University in Leipzig. He was a post doctoral researcher at the Fritz Haber Institute of the Max Planck Society Berlin-Dahlem (1990/91) and finished his habilitation in 1995. Eike Brunner was a Heisenberg Fellow of the Deutsche Forschungsgemeinschaft from 1997 until 2001 and worked at the University of California at Berkeley (USA) in the years 1997 and 1998. In 2001, he became Professor of Biophysics at the University of Regensburg (Germany). Since 1.10.2007, he is holding the Chair of Bioanalytical Chemistry at the TU Dresden. His research is focused to the application of solid-state NMR spectroscopy for materials characterization (porous materials like MOFs and carbons, materials synthesis in ionic liquids) and in biomineralization research (diatoms). He served as the speaker of the Department of Chemistry and Food Chemistry of TU Dresden from 2013 until 2016 and as a member of the advisory board of the Magnetic Resonance Section of the Gesellschaft Deutscher Chemiker (Society of German Chemists, GDCh) from 2013 until 2016.
