<p>Takahiro Sasamori received his PhD from Kyushu University in 2002. He joined the group of Prof. Norihiro Tokitoh at Kyushu University and followed him to the Institute for Chemical Research at Kyoto University in 1999 as a JSPS research fellow (DC1). There, he was promoted to Assistant Professor (2003) and Associate Professor (2009). In 2017, he established his own research group at Nagoya City University. His main research interests cover main-group element, organometallic, and heteroatom chemistry. During his career, he received several Bulletin of Chemical Society of Japan Awards (2002, 2005, 2007, 2009, 2010, 2013, and 2016), the Inoue Research Award for Young Scientists (2005), the Award for Young Chemists from the Chemical Society of Japan (2010), the Young Scientists' Prize from the Japanese Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science, and Technology (2011), and the Friedrich Wilhelm Bessel Research Award from the Alexander von Humboldt Foundation (2014).</p>
