What is the legal basis for the processing of personal data?

The legal basis for the processing of personal data for the above-mentioned purposes is Art. 6 para. 1 sub-para. 1 lit. a GDPR (consent).

Which personal data will be processed?

Only the personal data resulting from your data in the web form will be processed.

The following personal data will be processed:

- Name, first name
- Study program, semester
- Relevant details for the placement process
- Email address

How will personal data be processed and how long will it be stored?

The data collection takes place on a personal basis, exclusively for the purpose of registration, placement and participant's management as well as for event marketing. As a result, it will be possible to draw conclusions about specific individuals on the basis of the data collected.

The personal data will be deleted as soon as they are no longer required for the implementation of the project, at the latest upon the closure of the questionnaire process 12/2024.

Will personal data be transferred to third parties?

Personal data as application documents will be transferred to employers in particular cases. The process will be announced to the applicant before.

Will personal data be published?

Publication of the data is not planned.

Which are the general rights of data subjects?

Voluntariness and revocation (Art. 7 para. 3 GDPR)

The submission of personal data is voluntary. You can refuse or revoke your consent at any time without stating a reason to the person responsible for the data. Your personal data will then not

be processed any further. The revocation shall not affect the lawfulness of the processing that took place on the basis of the consent until the revocation.

Right of access to personal data (Art. 15 GDPR)

You have the right to obtain information on the data processed concerning your person, as well as the possible recipients of this data, at any time. They are entitled to a reply within one month of the responsible party for the data processing receiving their request for information.

Right to rectification, erasure and restriction (Art. 16- 18 GDPR)

You may request at any time that TU Dresden corrects or deletes your personal data and/or restricts its processing.

Right to data portability (Art. 20 GDPR)

You may request that the responsible party send you your personal data in a machine-readable form. Alternatively, you can request the direct transfer of your personal data to a different responsible party, insofar as this is possible.

Right to lodge a complaint (Art. 77 GDPR)

You can at any time contact TU Dresden's Data Protection Officer (see above) and, in the case of a complaint pursuant to Art. 77 GDPR, the responsible supervisory authority for data protection.
