Application	Nominated students should apply once their names are sent to Lehigh University via the online nomination form. Link will be provided directly to the student/s.
Eligibility	Must be enrolled as full-time student at a partner institution of Lehigh University. Completed a minimum of 1 year of university level study (by the time s/he starts at Lehigh) A cumulative GPA of 2.7 or above on a 4.0 scale; or its equivalent
Application documents	 Academic Transcript Statement of Purpose 1 Letter of Recommendation (LoR) English Proficiency requirements listed on above webpage for incoming exchange students

Admission and Course Registration

Admission process	Application files are reviewed by the College/Department of study and acceptance letters are sent to students directly. Once accepted, students will be provided with a username, email, and Lehigh Identification number (LIN) as well as be connected with their academic advisor and the International Office.
Semester course load	12 - 18 credits (4 - 6 courses)
Course registration	Course registration is online. Students will be provided with instructions upon acceptance. During the application process, students will provide a sample of courses from the <u>Course Catalog</u> that they are interested in taking at Lehigh. Students will work with their academic advisor in selecting courses and to receive overrides where possible.



Accommodation

Campus accommodation	All exchange students are guaranteed campus accommodation in fully-furnished residence halls with laundry service. The housing office will send students information and instructions on how to apply for <u>Upperclassmen</u> <u>Housing</u> or <u>upper-Class Themed Housing</u> <u>Communities</u> .
Meal plan	Students can choose their <u>meal plan</u> based on their housing option.

Visa and Health Insurance

Visa information	Students will work with the International Students and Scholars office to determine visa requirements and documents needed.
Health insurance	Exchange students are required to have insurance during their stay in the U.S. and studies at Lehigh University. Coverage for a comprehensive set of services includes doctors' visits, hospital admissions, day surgery, emergency services, mental health and substance abuse, and prescription drug coverage. Lehigh requires all students on an F-1 or J-1 visa to be enrolled in the Student Health Insurance Plan, administered by <u>University Health Plans, Inc.</u>
