



Regulations of the Vice-Rector Academic Affairs on the start of the 2021 summer semester

Due to the current pandemic situation, the Vice-Rector Academic Affairs has decided that, from now on and initially until Pentecost, i.e. until May 21, 2021, there will generally be **no on-site teaching**. Exempted from this regulation - under strict compliance with the [hygiene regulations](#) and the wearing of protective clothing, if necessary - are the courses that require physical attendance due to the nature of the acquisition of competencies (internships, laboratory experiments, etc.). The time until Pentecost as well as the lecture-free Pentecost week will be used to reassess the pandemic situation in order to discuss a possible return to on-site teaching.

The regulations for the [organization of the 2020/2021 winter semester and the 2021 summer semester](#), which had also been communicated in the circular email from the Vice-Rector University Culture (p.p. of the Vice-Rector Academic Affairs) of March 16, 2021, thus cease to apply.

For examinations taking place up until May 30, 2021, the current [regulations](#) for examinations will continue to apply until further notice. Nevertheless, it is strongly recommended to reduce on-site examinations to the necessary minimum and to only allow them to take place if the purpose of the examination and the associated acquisition of competencies require them to be conducted in this way.
