

TUD'S "E-LEARNING GEMS" COMPETITION

Goals of the competition

The competition, which was held for the first time in the summer of 2020, was originally intended to give visibility to e-learning content and new didactic concepts created during the pandemic semesters and to honor the commitment of teachers to good digital teaching. This basic idea still applies today, although it is now fundamentally about good examples of (partially) digital teaching/learning scenarios. In this context, we understand digital teaching or e-learning as the design of teaching/learning scenarios with the help of digital elements that can be used both face to face and online teaching or in a combination of both.

As in the first two rounds of the competition, the aim is to create a gallery of TUD's e-learning gems that can serve as inspiration and templates for future courses. So, we are looking for particularly successful e-learning content and concepts.

All submitted e-learning gems will be presented in a gallery, for everyone to view and appreciate. The three most popular gems in the voting will receive a prize of **€2,000 each** (this can be spent on student assistant (SHK) and research assistant (WHK) costs as well as material costs). The competition is financed through centralized funds for implementing TU Dresden's e-learning strategy.

Application

Unlike previous years, this year's e-learning gems can be submitted by lecturers themselves. In this round of the competition, nominated e-learning gems can be all digital teaching and learning content as well as special e-learning teaching instruments which were developed and used at TU Dresden in the course of the 2021/22 winter semester and the 2022 summer semester.

Competition formalities

Also, when submitting, please indicate which of the following three categories the gem can be placed in:

- Courses with up to 30 students
- Courses with 31 to 100 students
- Courses with over 100 students

At the end, the submitted e-learning gems will be published by the ZiLL in the "Gem Gallery" for viewing.

From **November 1 to 30, 2022**, all students and employees of Technische Universität Dresden can vote for the individual e-learning gems. The three gems with the most votes will each receive €2,000, which can be used for SHK/WHK costs and material costs. In order to give as many lecturers as possible the chance to win an award, the jwinning submissions of the previous years can only be admired, but not voted for.
