



Data protection declaration for the processing of personal data Information obligations according to GDPR

For what purpose will personal data be processed?

Personal data is processed in order to obtain an overview of existing/planned teaching cooperations of TU Dresden with external teachers and well as teaching tandems at TU Dresden. This is carried out in the context of the excellence measures for the promotion of research-guided learning and teaching (located at the Center for Interdisciplinary Learning and Teaching). In addition, personal data will be stored and processed for the purpose of contacting you, e.g. to inform you about support and qualification offers.

What is the legal basis for the processing of personal data?

The legal basis for the processing of data for the aforementioned purposes is Art. 6 para. 1 and sub para. 1 lit. a GDPR (Consent).

What personal data will be processed?

The following personal data is processed as part of the survey: last name; first name; type and extent of own participation in the courses in the winter semester 2020/2021, summer semester 2021 and winter semester 2021/2022 as well as the names of the persons involved in the courses.

For how long is personal data processed/stored?

The collection of data is person-related. This means that conclusions can be drawn about specific individuals based on the data collected. For archiving purposes, the data will be stored in an encrypted folder on the servers of TU Dresden and will be deleted at the end of the first funding phase of the excellence measure TSP (Teaching Synergy Program) on October 30, 2026 at the very latest.

What personal data will be transferred to third parties?

Unless stipulated otherwise by law or unless you have given your express consent in individual cases, no personal data will be transferred to third parties.

Is person-related data published?

No.

What are the general basic rights of data subjects?

1) Voluntariness and revocation according to Art. 7 para. 3 GDPR

Consent is voluntary. Consent to the processing of personal data may be revoked at any time pursuant to Art. 7 para. 3 GDPR. The personal data of the person in question will no longer be processed. The legality of the processing carried out on the basis of consent until revocation remains unaffected.

2) Right to information (Art. 15 GDPR)

Data subjects have the right to obtain information on the data processed concerning them, as well as the possible recipients of this data, at any time. You are entitled to a reply within one month of the responsible party for the data processing receiving your request for information.

3) Right to correction, deletion and limitation (Art. 16 - 18 GDPR)

Data subjects can contact TU Dresden at any time to demand the correction, deletion or the limitation of processing of their personal data.

4) Right to the transferability of data (Art. 20 GDPR)

Data subjects can request that the responsible party for the data processing transfers their data in a machine-readable format. Alternatively, you can request the direct transfer of your personal data to a different responsible party, insofar as this is possible.

5) Right of Appeal (Art. 77 GDPR)

Data subjects can at any time contact TU Dresden's Data Protection Officer and, in (see above), the case of a complaint pursuant to Art. 77 DSGVO, the responsible supervisory authority for data protection. The responsible authority is:
