For what purposes will personal data be processed?

The purpose of the processing is to handle complaints in order to counteract any form of harassment, discrimination and violence at the university.

What is the legal basis for processing personal data?

The legal basis for data processing for the above-mentioned purposes is Art. 6 para. 1 subpara. 1 letter c GDPR in conjunction with. § 13 AGG and the Guideline for Dealing with Harassment, Discrimination and Violence at TU Dresden.

What personal data is processed?

The following personal data is processed: Contact details of the person making the complaint; of witnesses; of the person opposing the complaint; data for processing the complaint.

How long is personal data processed/stored?

Based on the data collected, conclusions can be drawn about specific persons. The personal data will be deleted 1 year after the complaint has been resolved.

Is personal data transferred to third parties?

Unless otherwise stipulated by law or you have expressly consented in individual cases, no personal data will be transferred to third parties.

What are the basic rights of data subjects?

1) Right to information (Art. 15 GDPR)

Data subjects have the right to request information about the data processed about them and the possible recipients of this data at any time. They are entitled to a reply within a period of one month after receipt of the request for information.

2) Right to correction, deletion and limitation (Art. 16 - 18 GDPR)

Data subjects may request the rectification or erasure of their personal data or the restriction of processing at any time.

3) Right to object (Art. 21 GDPR).

Data subjects may, based on their particular situation, object to the processing of personal data concerning them at any time.

4) Right of appeal (Art. 77 GDPR).

Data subjects may contact the TU Dresden Data Protection Officer (see above) at any time, as well as the relevant Supervisory Authority for Data Protection in the event of a complaint pursuant to Art. 77 GDPR.
