## **Flexible Future in Point-of-Care Diagnostics**

As part of the work being carried out within the Silicon Nanowires Research Path at the TU Dresden Cluster of Excellence "Center for Advancing Electronics Dresden" (cfaed), researchers have developed a lightweight and mechanically flexible diagnostic platform based on cost-effective, highly sensitive silicon nanowire field effect transistors made of flexible polymeric foils that are only 100 µm thick. The researchers would like to develop a highly sensitive diagnostic platform that is quickly able to recognise viral or infectious diseases, especially in developing countries. The work was conducted jointly by the Leibniz Institute for Solid State and Materials Research Dresden (IFW) in collaboration with the Chair of Materials Science and Nanotechnology at TU Dresden and the NaMLab gGmbH.

## DIGS BB: "Fellow Award" and "Springboard to Postdoc"

The 4<sup>th</sup> "DIGS-BB Fellow Award" presentation took place on 11 June, 2015. This prize honours outstanding PhD candidates of the Dresden International Graduate School for Biomedicine and Bioengineering for excellent performance and challenging research topics, after the first year on the doctoral degree programme and upon the recommendation of the Thesis Advisory Committee. The DIGS-BB Fellow Award consists of a contract (65% of E13 pay scale) for the remainder of the PhD process. In this round, the Steering Committee presented the award to six DIGS-BB PhD candidates.

Moreover, the DIGS-BB Steering Committee reached a decision with regard to the applications for the third round of the "Springboard-to-Postdoc Programme". This DIGS-BB programme provides a post-doc position to talented PhD candidates from the DIGS-BB after the defence of their dissertation. The supervision must be taken on by another DIGS-BB group leader or a DIGS-BB partner group or alumni group. The objective of the programme is to ensure intensive supervision and to impart new scientific and methodological expertise at the same time as securing a subsequent post-doc position in another laboratory.

# **Technology Platform at the CRTD Begins its Work**

Cultivating human embryonic stem cells (hESCs) and producing induced pluripotent stem cells (iPSCs) from body cells for research purposes has been possible at the CRTD since the beginning of July as part of a service-oriented technology platform. As all human cells can be generated from these cells, the platform acts at the front line for future cell therapies and also for translational medical applications such as searching for active ingredients or modelling diseases in cell culture dishes. By establishing this service institution, which is open to all CRTD's network members as well as to external researchers, a further significant component in the support of translational research in accordance with the CRTD's concept has become a reality. www.crt-dresden.de

## **Funding Translational Projects at the CRTD**

The CRTD promotes the initiation of novel translational projects between groups from the core institute and its network members with its calls for proposals for Seed Grants. The selection criteria for these are the level of innovation, the translational potential, the quality of the work programme, the preparatory work, the likelihood of attaining the goal that has been set, the quality of the research team and the amount of financing applied for. The objective of the funding is to support preparatory work for risk-intensive projects, which then enables applications to be submitted to various funding bodies.

#### Groundbreaking Ceremony for new cfaed Building

The groundbreaking ceremony for the cfaed's new building complex took place at TU Dresden on 24 August. It was performed jointly by Minister of State Prof. Georg Unland (Saxon State Ministry of Finance), Matthias Hüchelheim (Saxon State Ministry of Science and the Arts) and the Rector of TUD, Prof. Hans Müller-Steinhagen. Lab and office workplaces will be created for the microelectronics Cluster of Excellence, along with meeting rooms and seminar rooms. The new building will replace the current southern wing of the Barkhausen Building on Nöthnitzer Straße and will include a completely new laboratory building for nanoanalytics in the inner courtyard of the Barkhausen Building. The construction costs are estimated at approximately 35 million euros and are being met by the Free State of Saxony. The handover of the rooms to the users is planned for winter 2017.

## 70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebrations of the United Nations at the WTC

This year, the United Nations is celebrating its 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary – and all of Dresden's inhabitants can celebrate along with the organisation. On 23 October, there will be a big UN party in the inner courtyard of the World Trade Center (WTC), hosted by the Dresden affiliate of the UN University. The City of Dresden, Technische Universität Dresden, UNICEF Dresden and the network "Dresden für Alle" are also among the co-organisers. "Since it was founded, the United Nations has embodied, as no other organisation has, the world's hopes for peace and improved living conditions," says Prof. Reza Ardakanian, Director of the Dresden Institute for Integrated Management of Material Fluxes and of Resources (UNU-FLORES) at the United Nations University. The UN University has its headquarters in Tokyo (Japan). In Germany, there are two UNU locations – Bonn and Dresden. UNU-FLORES in Dresden focuses on sustainable environmental and resource management. From 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., a varied stage and information programme has been planned, particularly aimed at children and young people. They will be able to learn about the work of the United Nations and its organisations while playing games and taking part in activities. The day will end with a ceremonial evening in the Dresden Kulturrathaus (town hall for culture).
