TU Dresden: 190 Years of History

1828	founded as a technical school
1890	renamed "Royal Saxon Technical College" (TH)
1945	largely destroyed during World War 2
1946	reopening of TH Dresden
1961	status of a University of Technology (TU)
1990	new faculties, comprehensive range of disciplines
2012	University of Excellence (successfully renewed in 2019)













Facts & Figures

the only technical comprehensive university in Germany

Students (WS 2020/21): 31,517

– international students: 9,952 from 125 nations

first-year students: 7,339

study programmes: 124

many cooperations with universities worldwide

employees: approx. 7,800 (2019)

of whom financed by third-party funds: approx. 3,250

• overall budget in 2019: 577,8 million Euros

of which third-party funds: 46%
