TU Dresden: 190 Years of History

- 1828 founded as a technical school
- 1890 renamed "Royal Saxon Technical College" (TH)
- 1945 largely destroyed during World War 2
- 1946 reopening of TH Dresden
- 1961 status of a University of Technology (TU)
- 1990 new faculties, comprehensive range of disciplines
- 2012 University of Excellence (successfully renewed in 2019)

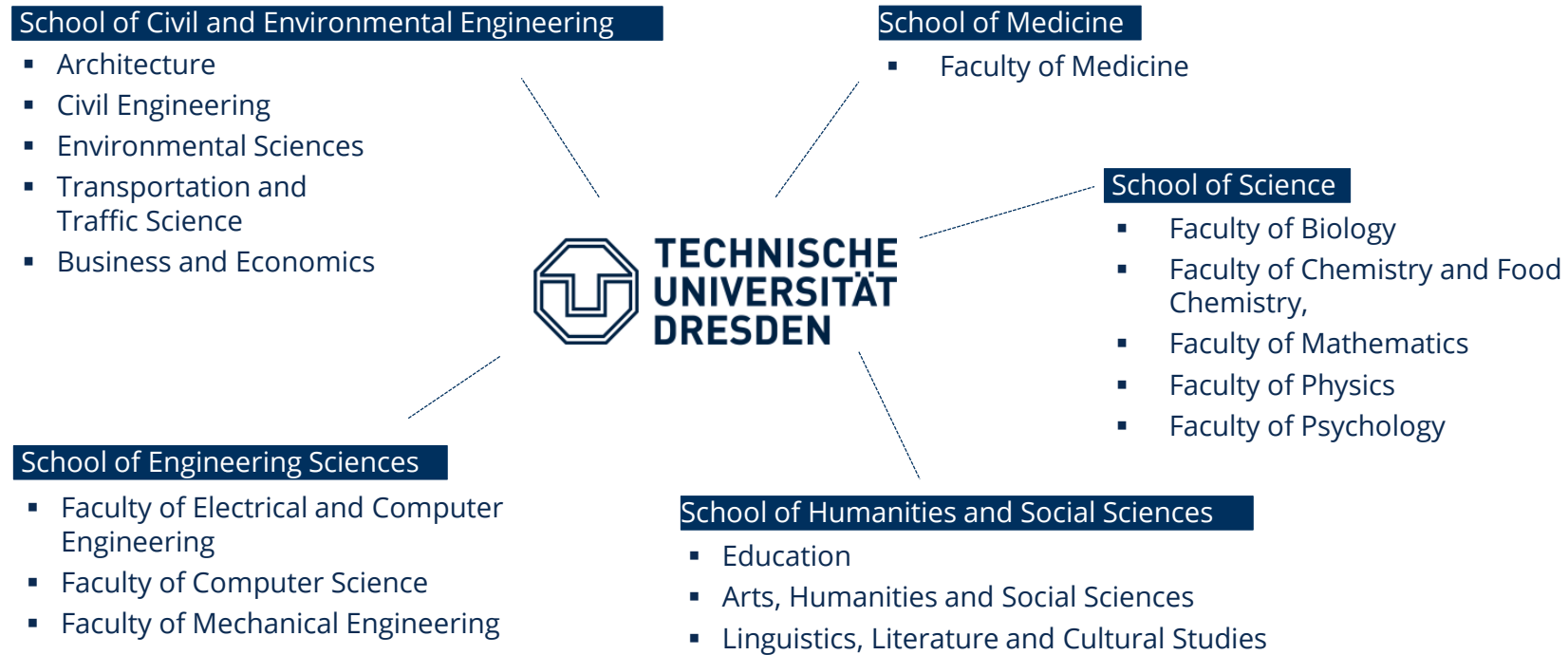


Facts & Figures

- the only technical comprehensive university in Germany
- Students (WS 2020/21): 31,517
 - international students: 9,952 from 125 nations
 - first-year students: 7,339
- study programmes: 124
- many cooperations with universities worldwide
- employees: approx. 7,800 (2019)
 - of whom financed by third-party funds: approx. 3,250
- overall budget in 2019: 577,8 million Euros
 - of which third-party funds: 46%

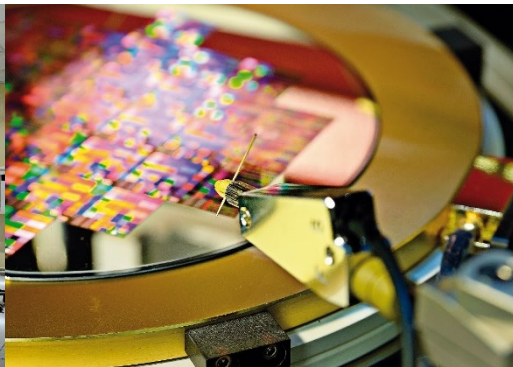


Five Schools – 17 Faculties
