8:00 pm – 9:00 pm		DIE BÜHNE Die Haifänger – an open-air play Perfect weather, far and wide not a cloud in the sky, mackerel and sand smelt fish swimming about! It could have been a fantastic weekend for the beach resort of Amity – but a shark killed a swimmer in the middle of the night, sending the city into pandemonium. "Die Haifänger" ("The Shark Catchers"), is a tragicomedy loosely based on Jaws that seeks to examine how the public and the media address invisible, biological dangers. An evening of edge-of-your-seat entertainment mixed with introspection about extinction and survival.

10:00 pm – 12:00 am		CAMPUSRADIO Live music and time to dance In line with Campusradio's tradition, the stage at the Weberplatz invites all to join in with an upbeat mood and dance music and will host a live performance of the Dresden punk rock band Focus.
5:00 pm – 6:00 pm		DIE BÜHNE Improvisational theater workshop In this workshop, participants will get a feel for improvisational theater. With just a little help and some basic techniques, they will use simple games to develop full stories. There is no script, no novel to base your work on – just the actors, the empty stage and a few prompts from which an improvised story will be played out.
6:00 pm – 7:00 pm		DIE BÜHNE "Schachvergiftung" – open rehearsal This play deals with the metaphorical game of chess between mania and self- assertion, based on the processing of trauma depicted in Stefan Zweig's novella "The Royal Game" (1942) and the Netflix miniseries "The Queen's Gambit" (2020). How does the cliché of genius and madness change in the presence of artificial intelligence? And what does mental health mean for strategic thinking? "Schachvergiftung" ("Chess poisoning") is a multimedia performance with projected and physical worlds of chess, featuring digital and analog players.

We will address the question: How does a film actually end up on the screen?
