What is the legal basis for the processing of personal data?

The legal basis for the processing of personal data is your voluntary and informed consent in accordance with Art. 6 para. 1 subpara. 1 letter a GDPR.

What personal data will be processed?

- First and last name, title
- Assigned structural unit (e.g. name of institute or chair)
- Degree program
- Email address
- External features (e.g. face) through image recording
- Features of the voice through sound recordings
- Information on the research project (in the form of the contribution made, abstract)
- Home address, Bank account details

How will the personal data be processed?

With your consent, the above-mentioned personal data (except for residential address, bank account data) may be published on the StuFoExpo 2024 [homepage](https://tud.link/bshuv8) (<https://tud.link/bshuv8>), on the Videocampus Sachsen (<https://videocampus.sachsen.de/>), Open Access (CC BY 4.0: Creative Commons Naming 4.0) via Qucosa and in other (digital) media for the purpose of visibility of the project and public relations work of the Technische Universität Dresden.

The e-mail address you provide will be used for contact purposes before, during and after the event, for example for the purpose of information about possible follow-up events. The residential address and account data will only be collected in the event of participation or receipt of a prize and will be stored until after the certificates have been sent or the payment transfer has been completed and then deleted (after two years at the latest). The data will be stored on TU Dresden servers until they are deleted or published.



What general rights do data subjects have?

To claim your rights, it is sufficient that you notify Ms. Anne Jaschan (see above) in writing (letter or email). However, the rights can only be exercised if the processed data allows for the identification of a natural person. It is a known fact that both the image or sound recordings and other project documents can be accessed worldwide when published on the internet and can be found in particular by search engines, that further use and/or modification by third parties cannot be ruled out and that under certain circumstances your rights (see below) may not be fully guaranteed. This relates in particular to deletion.

1) Voluntariness and revocation according to Art. 7 para. 3 GDPR

The submission of personal data is voluntary. Consent to the processing of personal data may be revoked at any time pursuant to Art. 7 para. 3 GDPR. The personal data of the person in question will no longer be processed.

2) Right of access to personal data (Art. 15 GDPR)

Data subjects have the right to obtain information on the data processed concerning them, as well as possible recipients of such data, at any time. You are entitled to a reply within one month after the responsible party receives the request for information.

3) Right to rectification, erasure and restriction (Art. 16 - 18 GDPR)

Data subjects may at request at any time that TU Dresden rectifies or erases their personal data or restricts its processing.

4) Right to data portability (Art. 20 GDPR)

Data subjects may request that the responsible party send them their personal data in a machine-readable format. Alternatively, they can request the direct transfer of their personal data to a different responsible party, insofar as this is possible.

5) Right to lodge a complaint (Art. 77 GDPR)

Data subjects can at any time contact TU Dresden's Data Protection Officer and, in the case of a complaint pursuant to Art. 77 GDPR, the responsible supervisory authority for data protection. The responsible supervisory authority is:
