Dr. Martin Humburg is Sector Economist in EIB's Projects Directorate, where he is responsible for appraising projects in the education and public research sector. Prior to joining EIB, he worked for a research consultancy in Brussels and a higher education quality assurance agency in Hannover. Dr. Humburg studied International Relations in Dresden, Lille, Berlin and Paris and holds a PhD in Economics from Maastricht University.

Article 309 of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union defines the criteria under which projects are eligible for financing by the European Investment Bank. During the project appraisal process, the EIB verifies the eligibility of projects proposed by promoters, and assesses their technical soundness, financial viability, economic return, and compliance with environmental protection and procurement regulations.

Dr. Humburg is the second presenter in this lecture series in cooperation with the EIB Institute. He will particularly address the EIB's appraisal of proposed projects and the role of the appraisal in the wider project cycle.
