Presentations

In the latter case, students are expected to base their presentation on a wider range of literature and materials. Participants should email me by **21st October**, indicating two topics (1st and 2nd preference) which they would be interested in presenting.

Seminar Papers

Students are free to choose topics for seminar papers (minimum 4000 words) as long as they are related to the topic of the seminar (they do not have to be based on the presentation). The papers will be due in spring (exact date to be determined). I will strongly support anyone who wants to attempt to publish their seminar paper with feedback and advice.

Audit

Students are welcome to audit the seminar. However, anyone who is auditing the course is expected to present a 5-minute commentary on one of the key readings/case studies. Students who would like to audit the course should email me by **21st October**, indicating a topic which they would like to comment on.
